## Count 14

On or about October 21, 2008, within the Southern District of California, defendant DOUGLAS NEIL RUBSAM, in a matter within the jurisdiction of the United States Department of Defense, a department and agency of the United States, did knowingly and willfully make false, fictitious and fraudulent statements and representations as to material facts, in that he did represent and state to an officer of the Defense Criminal Investigative Service, Office of Inspector General, Department of Defense, that he had "cut up" the debit card associated with a PayPal account that Rubsam had used in connection with overseas sales, whereas in truth and fact, as defendant then and there well knew, those statements and representations were false, fictitious and fraudulent when made; in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1001.
